



# PROBLEM

Prolonged drought over the past 6 1/2 years has affected major portions of the Brazos River watershed and these conditions are projected to continue for the foreseeable future. Water demands in the Brazos River Basin are **expected to nearly triple** by 2060, faster than the statewide average, based on State Water Plan projections for Regions G and H. As a result:

- Competition for river water has fueled tensions among stakeholders in the watershed.
- Organizations from the upper and middle portions of the river basin are seeking to restrict the flow of water downstream.
- Cutting off flows harms downstream communities, agriculture, natural habitats and commerce.

# SOLUTION

A fair allocation of river water is essential – and that requires:

- **Balanced management of river water and flood control** – based on sound science, engineering and law
  - More water conservation
  - Enforceable drought management
  - Enhanced water supplies throughout the Brazos River Basin

The LBRC seeks to ensure the river's limited resources are developed and managed for the benefit of all. The Coalition provides a collective voice for downstream interests as competition for water increases.



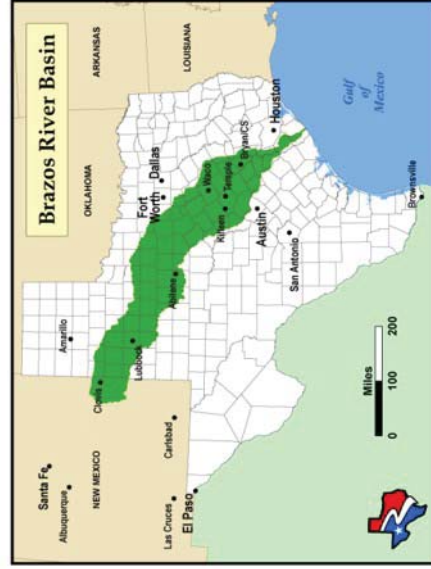
